

A Little About the Blues

t always amazes me how quickly summer passes from the first Tuesday after Memorial Day to the last before Labor Day. This summer began with Code Blue with Catya & Sue, proceeded through so many great bands to tonight's presentation of The JoyAnn Parker Band. We strive to present, from week to week, musical excellence. Someone seems to say, week in and week out, that "This was the best band you have had yet!" Thank you! That means we are doing a good job for you, our fans.

We believe the fact you keep coming back for more is a pretty good indicator also. Thank you so much for being here! Thanks for bringing a friend. We appreciate you so much! Still, after nine years of Tuesday Night Blues, there seem to be a lot of people that haven't even heard an echo of free concerts every Tuesday from Memorial to Labor Day. Somehow you found your way here, and we are so glad you have.

There are a handful of us that do most of the work it takes to put on 14 or 15 concerts, or maybe minifestivals is a better term. A weekly festival, with a variety of food and merchandise vendors, to the accompaniment of some of the best music the upper midwest has to offer, for a couple of hours, in the middle of the work week, in small town America. Hard to not love it! I know I do. We have something unique here, something many cities don't. Pretty cool!

There have actually been quite a few people involved over time. Buck Barrickman originally took the bull by the horns to run with the idea of spreading the one day Coalition Blues Fest over a number of weeks to offset the chance of rain. After the enhanced Tuesday Night Blues committee threw a combined \$80 on the table to start a checking account, Duane Kebschull (aka Danno) agreed to provide sound production, Bear Paw Construction (Mark Morgan) and Ken Fulgione became the first sponsors. We were up and running. Not sure how we would sustain it all, we had decided to create this "newsletter" featuring sponsors, band biographies, and "Blues Histories", as well as the season schedule as an organ to bring fans, sponsors and the Chippewa Valley Blues Society together. It has worked pretty well. By the way, every "Bluesletter" since the beginning is accessible at chippewavalleyblues.com under the Tuesday Night Blues tab, under TNB past.

We set a schedule, after deciding we might as well go for it and run from Memorial to Labor Day. Another innovation was to bring food vendors to create a festival ambience, both 9 Degrees Ice Cream and Joel's Weeny Wagon, as well as Juanita's Earrings, have been with us since the beginning, but the rest of our vendors, including Amy's Creations, Dickies Barbecue, Fire Truck Pizza, Hillside Henna, Big Girl Street Foods and Infinitea only make things better yet.

We got lucky with a 15 week first season to have almost all good weather, but it was touch and go a couple times. We decided, as we were trying to pay a decent fee for performers, that we needed an alternative weather venue, as we refused to cancel. There is always Tuesday Night Blues, rain or shine. We actually went inside one time because the heat index was predicted at about 104 degrees. Something you may not realize, if it is 80 degrees in the crowd it is about 95+ inside the bandshell.
