## Concert aims to make live music accessible for broad audiences

Mojo Lemon plays blues but not the kind that induces depression.

"It's not cry-in-your-beer blues," drummer Jason "Big J" Introwitz said.

The Eau Claire group prefers up tempo, high-energy blues by the likes of B.B. King and Buddy Guy.

Mojo Lemon will play during the "Lust for Blues" concert Saturday at Westgate Sportsman Club.

The daylong event is a fundraiser for Chippewa Valley Blues Society. With more than 100 members, the group formed in September to promote blues in the Chippewa Valley.

"Lust for Blues" will raise money to stage blues concerts and entice national acts to the Chippewa Valley," club President Ken Fulgione said.

The family-friendly concert has early starting and ending times. As one of its goals, the Blues Society wants to make live music accessible.

"Blues are the root of all music," Fulgione said. "We want people to experience the blues."

Mojo Lemon members have been active in the Chippewa Valley Blues Society.

"We're trying to bring (blues) to the surface," bass guitarist "Mojo" Terry Demars said. "There's so many good things coming out of (the society)."

The club gives blues fans a unifying voice, Demars added.

"There's always been a demand for blues around here," he said. "With this blues society, I think it's only going to improve."

Mojo Lemon formed in 1999. The group played practically every week until dissolving in 2005. The band got back together in July of last year.
